The Pulaski County Historical Society was formed in 1965, part of the mission statement of the society was, and still is, to collect, to educate and to preserve our county's history.

Built in 1894 of Indiana Limestone, the Pulaski County Courthouse is the most significant governmental building in the county. It is the core of Winamac's commercial district. It is also the county's sole example of Romanesque Revival style architecture.

The Courthouse is the symbol of the seat of government in Pulaski County. It has been recognized for its significance in architecture, politics and government as a historically significant structure by the State and National Register of Historic Places on October 24, 2007.

There are various resources available for the restoration and preservation of historical structures in Indiana. One such resource is the office of Indiana Landmarks and Historical Preservation. We have taken the initiative to reach out to Indiana Landmarks seeking resources they may have available to our county.

We stand by to help in any way we can to preserve this valuable Pulaski County landmark.
